The sun came out just in time to celebrate the Grand Opening of the Early Years Foundation Stage Playground at Coppice Primary School.




The playground has been refurbished thanks to a grant of £9942 from The National Lottery. This included artificial grass, mud kitchen, play boat and scooters.

Unfortunately the weather was atrocious, however it didn't appear to dampen the enthusiasm of those of you who braved the elements, so thank you for coming along and supporting this event.


Heanor Health Facilities



The former Heanor Memorial Hospital cared for generations of local residents from its opening in 1925 until its closure in September 2013. It was demolished in the autumn of 2015. The new healthcare facilities are due to open in spring 2017 with construction starting in the next few months. Reserve at Loscoe.


The reserve is managed on their behalf by Gary Wain of Groundwork, with the help of conservation volunteers and local residents.
